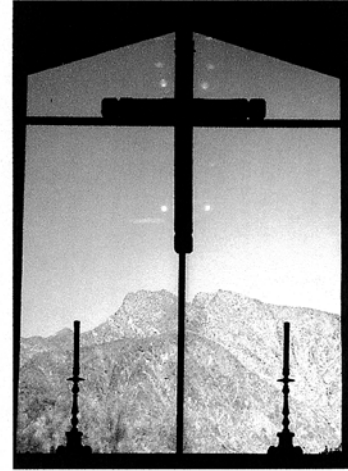

Advent - A Time of Joyful, Watchful Waiting

Here we are in the season of Advent at the beginning of a new liturgical year. The long-awaited one is coming; and we wait in joyful expectation, like Mary did awaiting his birth. This is not a “purple” season of penitence but a “blue” (the Mary Color) season” in which we ponder and pay attention to the signs of his coming, and to his movement **within us!**

In her Advent greeting, Our Presiding Bishop wrote: “The world is waiting for the birth of the long-expected One, who will bring healing and peace to all who labor and suffer in darkness. We still wait in eager expectation for the one who will lead soldiers to turn their weapons into tractors and hay balers and redirect warriors to schools of peace.”

What might we do while we wait? Archbishop Schori suggests: “There are many other creative and life-giving ways to wait. What do you dream of, what does that healed world look like? Once you have the beginnings of a concrete picture, an attitude of expectation will lead you to see that vision becoming reality in small and quiet ways.

Our Savior is coming to bring light and cast out our darkness. In our watchful waiting, let us hone our abilities to see and hear and feel in our hearts the signs of his coming. Where will we discover him anew?

MINISTRY FAIR

On Sunday, November 14 following our church service, parishioners gathered in the courtyard with their refreshments and took advantage of information provided on the many volunteer opportunities at St. Barnabas.

Laura+ set up an inviting table offering material on her Christian Education ministry. Many expressed interest in Bible Study, Advent Study, an Inquirers' Class and Prayer Meetings. Wendy Quinn's Parish Life and Hospitality booth included a photo display by Photography Coordinator Faye Dorsey, as well as descriptions of the various subcommittees (*Carillon*, Communication/Publicity, Women and Men of St. Barnabas, Sarah's Circle, Holy Happy Hour, Special Events and Newcomer Welcome) and volunteer sign-up sheets.

Choir Director Trent Kleinkopf and Pastoral Care Coordinator Victor Levine shared a table, where they urged inquirers to volunteer as singers or accompanists and to participate in the prayer chain and home visitations.

Borrego Serves, a new ministry spearheaded by Joya Hoyt addresses community needs which are not being met elsewhere. This generated a lot of interest, most notably donations which to date have covered half the cost of a new engine for the truck which Ernie Loza uses in his Slab City Ministry.

The fair was a success and hopefully will be an ongoing event with increasing participation. Thanks to all!



Trent developed an interest in music at a young age, and was active in school choirs in junior high and high school. He also plays the guitar. Growing up Catholic, he did not join a church choir until he moved to the Episcopal Church in 1995. His choir director soon encouraged him to perform solos. During this time in his life he also met Alex and Nancy Nagy in his home town, Pocatello, Idaho. After the Nagys moved to Borrego Springs, Trent and his partner, Cal Hoskins, visited them one Thanksgiving and were so taken with the community that they eventually relocated. Lucky for us!

At St. Barnabas, Trent plans to transition the choir from singing mostly in unison to using more harmony. He thanks organist Bonnie Walker for helping him choose hymns which are favorites with the congregation. He and Bonnie practice together two or more hours per week, in addition to the hour and a half of choir practice and another two to four hours at home, with Cal as his critic. Following a career as a behavioral specialist working with autistic children, Trent now volunteers regularly at the Frugal Coyote and of course devotes his time to music and the St. Barnabas choir.
