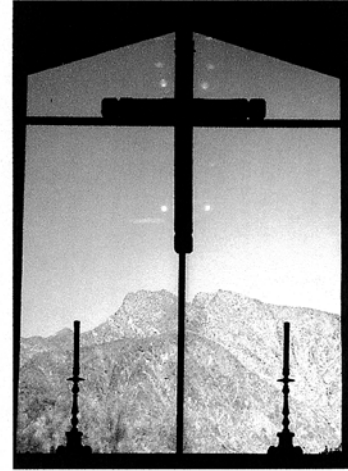

Annual Meeting, January 16, 2011

It was a smooth, good-humored, and skillfully orchestrated plenary meeting, during which the 2010 Annual Meeting Minutes were approved, nominated members for the new Vestry were identified, while outgoing members were recognized for their service. Special thanks were extended to Cathy Gay for her service as Senior Warden, especially during the period preceding Rector Laura's arrival in March, 2010.

The three Vestry nominees: Tracy Alexander, Josie Blucker and Brad Tidwell, were elected unanimously, followed by convention delegates Louise Burmester and Marka Mitchell and alternates Cathy Gay and Jim Bennett. No alternatives were named from the floor.

Rector Laura conducted the proceedings with dispatch, while reminding us that we, (Rector and congregation,) were the light of Christ, and therefore under a solemn obligation to serve others. That service, she said, covered the regular connections we maintained with members of the St Barnabas, as well as those represented by the Food Bank and Borrego Serves, in addition to the other, organized ways we have chosen, with God's help, to act in the name of Jesus.

Laura cited our work as the fulfillment of God's dream and urged us to live our faith more fully in reaching out to help those in need, especially on the local level. Our faith, she emphasized, is what sustains us, now and always.

Despite the fact that we were currently below target on pledges, Finance Committee Chair, Dave Leibert, pointed out, the bright side was that our principle at Wells Fargo is increasing with the recovery of the economy and the interest on our principle covered the shortfall in our 2010 budget.

Seen from January's perspective, Rector Laura suggested we should be of good heart and not be overly concerned that we might end the year in the red. Rather, she suggested, we should put our faith fully to work as we go about the task of ensuring the continuation of our sacred lives.

In terms of the current level of pledges, pledge director Bill Walker stated that the call for increased pledges had been largely successful, though the \$94,000 goal for 2011 had yet to be reached. At present, he stated, we are at \$81,000 pledged. He urged timely cooperation from those who had not yet pledged.

A printed agenda was circulated to the congregation that provided background information on the 2011 budget and details on the range of Vestry commitments which continue into the new year and beyond.

Upcoming events include commissioning of the Vestry and Alison Royle's lecture on her work in Africa (both on January 30), the six-week Inquirers' Class beginning January 27, 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. (you can still participate if you miss a session or two), and the Bishop's visit on March 6.

The meeting concluded with the Committee Reports. The Parish Life/Hospitality and Hospitality Committee still needs a Special Events Coordinator and more writers for the *Carillon*, so all you social butterflies and aspiring authors please talk to Wendy Quinn or Lynn Wilderson. The Buildings & Grounds Committee is looking at our gardening services and how the schedule and scope might be improved.

Our next Vestry meeting will be the all-day retreat at the Rectory on Saturday, February 26.
